Norman Regional Donates \$48000 to WMC

Two hospitals came together to support each other as Norman Regional Health System presented a check for \$48,000 to Winston Medical Center. All of the donated funds will go toward providing assistance for employees of Winston Medical Center who were affected by a recent tornado.


Norman Regional Health System President and CEO David Whitaker along with Anne Clouse, executive director of the Norman Regional Health Foundation, and Jim Wade, foundation board member, all paid it forward to the disaster-stricken community last week. Paul Black, Winston Medical Center CFO, Will Hill, the mayor of Louisville, hospital employees and hospital board members all attended the check presentation.



After the May 20, 2013 tornado devastated Moore Medical Center many Norman Regional Health System employees were affected and had to deal with losing homes, the uncertainty of the future, and what would happen to their careers. Whitaker said this experience of loss compelled Norman Regional

“A little bit more than a year ago, we lived through what those folks in Louisville, Mississippi are living through now,” Whitaker said. “When I got a notice from the American Hospital Association about the line of storms on April 28, it kind of dawned on me that it’s been a year and we’re well into our healing process. It really was time to pay back those favors and pay it forward.”

Winston Medical Center’s hospital was a total loss in the disaster and its nursing home also suffered damage. Employees are currently working out of a temporary, modular hospital. Whitaker said a food truck had been converted to a state-approved hospital kitchen and that the nursing home was expected to open 60 beds by September 1.



Whitaker got in touch with Black only a few days after Winston Medical Center was hit by a tornado, so that he could offer support and advice on what to expect in the recovery and rebuild of the hospital.

“We’ve had numerous conversations on what to expect.” Whitaker said. “Helping employees deal with issues, that’s the most difficult part of all this — buildings can be rebuilt; insurance companies are just that companies, but with employees, it’s hard,” Whitaker said.

Whitaker said he never doubted Norman Regional’s employees would respond to such a cause. Clouse added that Norman Regional has a strong philanthropic culture.

“When you look at all the things our employees support. They support the Foundation, the United Way, they support so many other organizations such as American Heart Association or American Cancer Society. When we looked at our overall giving last year, our employees gave over \$300,000 to the Norman community, so it doesn’t surprise me that once again they’d be so generous especially for something that hits so close to home,” she said.

The Norman Regional Health Foundation donated \$20,000; the Norman Regional Auxiliary Volunteer Group donated \$4,000; and Norman Regional Health System employees donated \$24,000 to Winston Medical Center. Clouse said that when raising money for Winston Medical Center was decided on as the hospital’s big pay it forward project, an email was sent to all 2,800 employees and within minutes employees were walking into the foundation office ready to give.

During the check presentation Black said a few words, but became choked up and had to turn the floor over to Whitaker. A banner hung behind the two hospital administrators that read “Stronger Together #MooreStrong #WinstonStrong.” When the oversized check was presented, all of Winston Medical Center’s employees were surprised as no one except Black knew the total beforehand. Whitaker said being at Winston Medical Center was an emotional experience that provided him closure.

“It kind of came full circle. Some of those same feelings that tug at your heart I experienced again speaking with those employees (at Winston Medical Center),” he said.

Clouse said going to Winston Medical Center was a moving experience she was happy to have been a part of.

“They really rolled out the red carpet for us.” Clouse said. “After David presented the check, it seemed like every employee had to hug us and thank us. They would come up to us in tears and say ‘please go back to your employees and tell them how grateful we are.’”

“They wanted to tell us their stories and it was therapeutic for them because we’d been through the same thing, and we were sharing stories about those days after the tornado and recovery. I think it was also important in our healing process to pay it forward.” The hospital also sent another banner to Mississippi that was signed by Norman Regional employees during National Hospital Week. Whitaker said that Norman Regional received similar banners from across the country after the May 20 tornado. Winston Medical Center employees took time during their work day to read messages of hope and inspiration on the banner.

As you all know, the Executive Committee of WMC was very gracious to pay each employee’s insurance premiums until July 31, 2014. This has been a tremendous help to all of us, and I can’t thank them enough.

For those employees who are still working, please remember beginning with the first pay payroll in August your insurance premiums will be deducted from your payroll. Please look over your check stub carefully as this will be the first payroll which includes the changes you may have made during open enrollment.

For those employees who are not working, your last day of coverage for your insurance policies will be July 31, 2014. Within the first 10 days of August you will receive COBRA information from Conexis. Conexis administers our COBRA plan for Blue Cross, Always Care Vision and Always Care Dental. Please read the information carefully and respond if you wish to continue your coverage through the COBRA plan. If you have coverage through Colonial, there are a couple of different options for you. Doctor Gentry is no stranger to Winston County as he was born at Winston Medical Center and raised in Kosciusko, Mississippi. His parents are Doug and Lenita Gentry.
